## Penny Wars Guidelines



1. Each grade will have one (1) labeled penny container, which will be kept in their assigned classroom from the beginning of the school day on Monday, January 30, until Noon on Thursday, February 2. **On Monday, Mr. Huffman will have the jars in the lobby at 7:45 a.m. From 7:45 - 7:50 a.m. only silver may be put into the jars, no matter the source.** After that any pennies may be put into the jars. At 8:00 a.m. the jars will be delivered to the assigned classrooms.
2. Each penny inserted into a class's container is worth one (1) point.
3. Each silver coin (nickels, dimes, quarters, half dollars, silver dollars) is worth MINUS however many points it is worth. For example, if a class's container has 25 pennies in it and somebody puts a quarter in that same container, then that class has zero (0) points.
4. The object of this competition is to end up with the most points at the end of the week. The ranking will be determined by whoever has the most points, down to whoever has the least points.
5. People can "sabotage" other classes by putting silver coins in those other classes' containers. This is where strategy is important if a class is to maintain its lead. Dollar bills may not be used in place of silver coins. Only coins may be used.
6. AT NO TIME is anyone, besides a teacher, allowed to take the top off of a penny container FOR ANY REASON. If it is discovered that people from one class have "messed with" another class's container, that class will be disqualified from the Penny Wars and awarded "0" points for this game.
7. Once a jar is full - it is done! Nothing can be added and nothing can be taken away once the jar is full. No extra jars are given.
8. Penny jars cannot be hidden and must be in an easily accessible place for the students.

## Formal Dress Code For Ladies

The appearance of Victory Christian students and their guests at this year's Homecoming and Junior/Senior Banquets is to be one of appropriate modesty. This is not only for the protection of the girls and boys, but also to help everyone follow the principles set forth in Philippians 4:8. We are asking for your assistance in keeping the minds and hearts of everyone pure.

Things to consider while shopping for a dress:

1. Ladies dresses should fit so that no cleavage can be seen during the evening's events.
2. No bare midriff, strapless dresses, or bare lower backs are allowed. The top of the back can be open.
3. Dresses must have two shoulder straps significant enough to support the top of the dress. Undergarments must not be visible.
4. See-through material must have an appropriate lining.
5. Skirt and Dress Length
  - A. Skirts and dresses should be no higher than the top of the kneecap.
  - B. Slits should be not more than four inches above the kneecap.
